

Built by one of St. Joseph's first millionaires Ferdinand Westheimer; he hired Eckel & Mann to design his home in 1885. This young German immigrant came to St. Joseph in 1859 and opened Westheimer & Sons Mercantile. He expanded it to Westheimer & Sons Distillers and quickly moved into the growing ranks of the millionaire class. His famed "Red Top Rye" whiskey was available across the United States and featured in the 1904 St. Louis World's Fair!
